



Its Time To End Care Charges in Scotland.

Thousands of older and disabled people are asked to pay for their social care services in Scotland. For services such as help to get out of bed in the morning or to buy essential groceries people can pay hundreds of pounds a month out of their state welfare benefits, savings or earnings.

Care charging demands that older and disabled people pay more than any able bodied person to achieve their basic human rights and a dignified life. In some instances it can lead to a disabled individual deciding to do without much needed care and support, a decision which might lead to significant risk of harm or further deterioration of their health.

We, the undersigned, call on the Scottish Government to use their existing powers to abolish all local authority charges for non-residential care services under the Community Care and Health (Scotland) 2002 Act.
